1. Which is the oldest unearthed boat?

The earliest boat, named <u>Pesse canoe</u>, was a <u>prehistoric</u> boat. For the fabrication of the boat at that time, a hollow <u>pine tree</u> trunk was utilized. It is a boat from <u>the Mesolithic period</u>, between 8200 and 7600 BC. It is about a 10000-year-old boat. <u>Fossils</u> of a Pesse canoe boat were found at the time of the trenching of roads in the <u>Netherlands</u>. Actually, in 1955, the road was trenched for the construction of a highway. Pesse canoe is retained at the <u>Drents</u> <u>Museum in Assen</u>, Netherlands.

2. When was sailing introduced at the Olympic Games for the first time?

<u>Sailing</u> was first contested in the <u>1900 Paris Olympic Games</u>. From its inclusion in the Olympic Games, <u>sailing</u> has been a vital part except only in 1904, when it was excluded from the <u>St Louis</u> Olympic games. It is an open event where men and women compete together.

3. Do you know the name of the country that won the highest number of gold medals in sailing?

The highest gold medals in sailing are won by Great Britain. Great Britain is indeed the most successful country in sailing at the Olympics, with 66 medals.(till 2024).

4. How to distinguish a boat from a ship?

When compared to <u>boats</u>, <u>ships</u> are bigger. Ships are fabricated for long distances while traveling along the <u>ocean</u>. As compared to ships, boats are relatively small. Boats are utilized when there is short distance travel or in <u>coastal regions</u>.
